


I'm Glad My Mom Died by Jennette McCurdy - B MCCURDY

This hilarious and heartbreaking memoir deals with issues like addiction, abuse, and eating disorders with humor and candor. Told as a series of short stories, it shines a light on the dark realities of childhood fame. Even if you didn't grow up watching iCarly this book is great for anyone who is interested in the entertainment industry or just looking for something to make you laugh and cry.

The Stolen Heir by Holly Black - YA SFF BLACK (NEW)

Picking up eight years after Black's "The Queen of Nothing," this first book in a duology follows runaway queen Wren as she teams up with Prince Oak. In Wren's absence from court, her mother has harnessed an ancient power that allows her to create an army of monsters from sticks and snow. Wren must join Oak on his quest to defeat her mother and protect the kingdom of Elfhame. With plenty of twists, a slow-burn romance, and a fascinating female narrator, you'll be waiting not-so-patiently for book two!





Daisy Darker by Alice Feeney - FIC FEENEY

Well it doesn't get much darker than this "dysfunctional family" thriller that keeps you guessing through the whole book, but don't count on figuring it out. Just when you thought you'd pieced something together the ball drops again. I didn't know what to expect from this title as reading commenced, but the page turning kept up a quick pace in this suspenseful read. The author has at least four other thriller type fictions under her belt if you want to read more of her work.
