





Blurp's Book of Manners - Cindy Derby



A bright story about how the very best manners must also contain kindness and patience with people you meet! (Plus a few good fart jokes) Ages 3 and up







Inspired by the 16th century marriage portrait of Lucretia de'Medici, O'Farrell reimagines the life of the young woman portrayed in the painting. Married at 13, Lucrezia must navigate the move from her family home in Florence to the court of Ferrara, while trying to figure out her enigmatic new husband. This moody historical novel is full of intrigue and twists, fine-spun details, and a strong sense of place.


The Banshees of Inisherin



