SIGNIFICANCE	Unknown Unknown <sup>19</sup> HISTORICAL OR ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE This structure is the purest and best preserved example of the Queen Anne style of Victorial architecture extant in Durham. Its facade contains a two story porch supported by turned posts and sawn brackets and is ornamented with inbricated shingles. The front doors, origin to the house, are double leafed with multipaned glazing. The south side boasts a 2 story bay/dormer, three-sided on the first floor, four-sided on the second. The fenestration displays the irregularity and asymmetry characteristic of the Queen Anne style's concen- tration on the picturesque. The sheathing of the house also displays the varied textures, shaped shingles and clapboards, for example, characteristic of the style. A 1½ story shed roof addition stands to the rear of the main block and appears to have been built early in the 20th century. To the rear of and attached to this addition is a contemporary garage. A 1½ story barn, sheathed with vertical flushboards, stands to the rear of the house. The houses was built in 1898/99 for George J. Francis, who became owner and chief executive officer of the Merriam Manufacturing Co. in 1895. He sold the house in 1903 to David P. Warner, whose family owned the house until 1938, when it became the property of John C. Otte. The house passed to its present owners in 1972. Architecturally, this house is significant as one of the best examples of late Victorian architecture in Durham, and as the purest expression in the town of the Queen Anne style.
